THE PROJECT

In 2014, at the height of the Ebola crisis, a representative of the German Red Cross visited the maternity wards of numerous hospitals in Monrovia, showing the state of the operating theaters and the relative departments dedicated to sterilization.

The results of the analysis of the used equipment showed a serious lack in quality of those components that were supposed to guarantee a correct and healthy water supply.

The project was conceived with the intention of providing essential medical equipment for adequate care of patients, new mothers and newborns, at every stage of their stay, in a country with a high epidemic risk in relation to devastating pathologies such as yellow fever, typhoid, meningitis, tuberculosis, hepatitis, AIDS and malaria.

CHALLENGES FACED

The challenges faced by Q&T have been numerous. The focal point was the need to organize the shipment and installation of delicate equipment in different locations in Liberia despite the few means and infrastructures not always adequate.

Despite the difficulties encountered, the Q&T team has been able to face every challenge by completing the project, within the deadline and with an optimal level of satisfaction.

SOLUTIONS OFFERED

Q&T has contributed to raising health standards through the supply of state-of-the-art medical equipment, such as autoclaves and sterilizers, and the vast array of equipment associated with testing and laboratory activities.

RESULTS

Following the implementation of the project, clinics and hospital facilities in Monrovia – capital and the most populous city of Liberia – have recorded an increase in the sanitary standard, averting the relapse into epidemic outbreaks up to then present due to the bad state in which they poured the old equipment supplied.

Numerous laboratories and several maternity wards have been set up, guaranteeing an improvement in the health standard and protecting thousands of mothers and babies from the serious pathologies that have been plaguing the country for decades.
